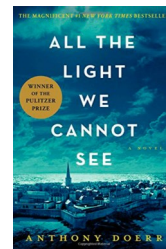
**All the Light We Cannot See**

**Library Electronic Resources**



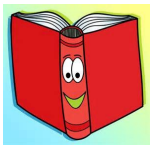

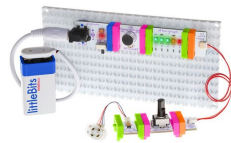
## Time for Stories: 2s, 3s, & their caregivers

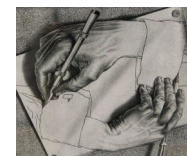
## Pokémon Club
