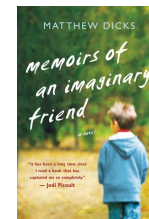

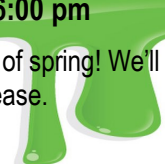
KEVA Plank Engineering Challenges

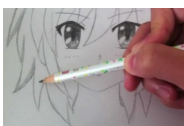
