




The Trials of Apollo series




Left Out

An eleven-year-old boy from the city spends the summer with relatives on a farm, where he meets his cousin, Harris. Together, they have many fun adventures and learn what family really means.




Space Case






The War that Saved my Life





by Christopher Paolini



by Gary Paulsen



by Brandon Mull


